MUNICIPAL UPDATES

Garbage and Recycles

On the Municipal side of things there are a couple of updates to pass along. We have partnered with the Village of Doaktown to sign a new contract for collection of solid waste and recyclables. We are also looking at the viability of purchasing a garbage/recycle truck. There will be a rotation all winter months of garbage one week and recycles the next. Keep an eye out for our calendar with schedules. Remember everything we recycle saves us money on tipping fees and makes the cells where solid waste is put last longer.

Tourism

We have partnered with the Village of Doaktown and the Village of Blackville to work with the province to push our area in the forefront of tourism. A consultant has been hired to work on and bring together a plan. The Sentier trail system along with the Snowmobile Club/Federation and the ATV Club/Federation will be the first phase. Then spreading out to our beautiful tourist/sightseeing locations along with our Heritage, Events & Outside Activities.
