In December the group reviewed **In Search of April Raintree by Beatrice Culleton Mosionier**. This was our first novel by an aboriginal author with an aboriginal theme.

Two young sisters are taken from their home and family. Powerless to change their fortunes, they are separated, and each put into different foster homes. Yet over the years, the bond between them grows. As they each make their way in a society that is, at times, indifferent, hostile, and violent, one embraces her Métis identity, while the other tries to leave it behind. In the end, out of tragedy, comes an unexpected legacy of triumph and reclamation.

Most members felt that it was an important story to tell and to read about. Members felt the writing style kept the reader protected from the harshness of the topics being discussed. The story spoke to many members on different levels.

There were also 10 critical essays at the end of the book that discussed different aspects of the storyline. Most book club members just skimmed the essays. One member who did read all the essays found them very informative.

Ratings range from 6 – 9 with the average being 7.5

Topics of discussion included: Styrofoam, Smudging, New Babies

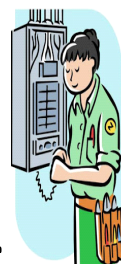
