In the Rural Community of Upper Miramichi (RCUM) you can find many opportunities for fun and adventure!

<u>Fall Brook Falls -</u> The highest falls (at 100ft) in New Brunswick. From Rte. 8 in Boiestown, take the 625, up to Bloomfield Ridge Road. (turn right) towards Holtville Road. Straight across Norrad's bridge. A left onto the County Line Road will take you to Irving's gate (\$10 per Auto, ATV/UTV not allowed) to enter on their property. A pleasant drive on woods road (dirt) will get you to Fall Brook. A moderate hike is necessary to get to the falls.

RCUM Community Park — (formerly Red Pines) Fun for all ages, we have a well equipped playground including a large splash pad (with bucket!) Cool off, enjoy! As well as a covered surface to stay out of the hot summer sun and still enjoy outdoor activities such as ball hockey, basketball, to name a few and even full size tennis courts. We also have picnic shelters to enjoy your lunch in the shade. Within the park you will also find a smaller inner walking trail as well as an outer larger trail (roughly 1km around) sheltered by the large pine trees.


Situated across from our legendary Woodsman's Museum.

LUMBERJACK'S LOG

THE STORY OF EMILY ALLAIN

If there was something happening in Boiestown, Emily Allain would be the first to know. Who was Emily Allain and how was she at the forefront of all social and private affairs?

Emily was the switchboard operator for Boiestown's first telephone service, called the Holt Line. With one party line that cost 20¢/call to connect people between Boiestown and Doaktown, Emily would hear all the town gossip through her headset. The telephone office was in Emily's home, where she operated the one party line (with some assistance).

Emily and her husband Lee, settled in Boiestown in 1923, building their house using pieces of an old Roman Catholic Chapel. She met her husband while she was working at Duffy's Hotel, and through his support and her determination, Emily held multiple titles during her lifetime. From assisting the local doctor as a midwife, to serving on the school board, Emily Allain was the glue that kept this community together.


