

Opening of GMRSC Offices:

The offices of the GMRSC are closed to the public as we do our part to help limit the spread of the Covid - 19 virus. However, services are continuing to be provided on an appointment basis (no walk ins will be permitted). As public health guidelines are lessened, return to normal operating procedures will occur. If members of the public require the services of the Commission, they are encouraged to book an appointment. Staff are available to provide direction and advice to clients relating to a variety of construction, development projects and answer questions related to the programs offered by Solid Waste Services. Arrangements can be made to submit building or subdivision plans for review (either digitally or dropped off at the office at 1773 Water Street).

Recycling Program Temporarily Suspended:

The residential curbside recycling program is temporarily suspended. The facility that sorts and processes the material is temporarily closed due to Covid-19. Garbage collection will occur weekly until further notice. We would ask residents to stockpile recyclables for as long as possible to be recycled at a later date. It is anticipated that the curbside program will return in late May or early June.

The HHW events normally held in May, have been cancelled and hope to be rescheduled for the Fall of 2020.






